8. **1841 England, Wales and Scotland Census.** George Millett and Eliza Millett are living at Montpellier Road, Brighton, Sussex. Twelve others reside with them, including three of their children - Edward, Agnes and Arthur. Findmypast, accessed 08/02/2019.
9. **England and Wales Deaths 1837-2007.** Eliza Amelia Millett died in the fourth quarter of the year, in 1868, in Brighton. Findmypast, accessed 08/02/2019.
10. **Essex Baptism Index 1538-1917.** Amelia Millett, daughter of George and Eliza Amelia, is baptised on 10 February, 1822, in Great Dunmow, Essex. Findmypast, accessed 27/02/2019.
11. **England and Wales Marriages 1837-2005.** Amelia Millett married Frederick Watkins (three other men listed as possibilities) in the third quarter of 1847. Findmypast, accessed 27/02/2019.
12. **England and Wales Marriages 1837-2005.** Frederick Watkins married Amelia Millett (three other women listed as possibilities) in the third quarter of 1837. Findmypast, accessed 27/02/2019.
13. **1851 England, Wales and Scotland Census.** Frederick and Amelia Watkins are living in Thrybergh, Rotherham, Yorkshire. Twelve others are listed in the household, including their three children (Agnew, Frederick and Edith), Agnes Millett (sister-in-law) and Eliza Amelia Millett (mother-in-law, widowed). 14. **1861 England, Wales and Scotland Census.** Frederick and Amelia Watkins are living at Private Villa House, Thrybergh Common Side, Rotherham, Yorkshire. Thirteen others reside there, including their children Agnew, Frederick, Edith, Arthur, Florence and Leonard. Findmypast, accessed 27/02/2019.
15. **1871 England, Wales and Scotland Census.** Frederick and Amelia Watkins reside at The Lodge, Ravenfield, Rotherham, Yorkshire. The other eight residents include their children Florence, Ella and Frederick. Findmypast, accessed 27/02/2019.
16. **England & Wales Deaths 1837-2007.** Amelia Watkins died in the fourth quarter of 1872, in Rotherham. Findmypast, accessed 27/02/2019.

17. **England Births and Baptisms 1538-1975.** Henry Creighton Agnew, son of John and Elizabeth, was born in 1797, baptised on 5 October, 1797. Findmypast, accessed 01/02/2019.
18. **Westminster Marriages.** Henry Crichton Agnew married Maria Petros in 1833 at St George, Hanover Square. Findmypast, accessed 28/02/2019.
19. **Scotland, Newspaper Death Reports.** Henry Crichton Agnew died in 1854. Reported in the Scotsman Periodical, March 8, 1854. Findmypast, accessed 28/02/2019.
20. **Westminster Baptisms.** Elizabeth Agnew, daughter of John and Elizabeth, born on 12 September, 1798, was baptised on 19 January, 1803. Findmypast, accessed 01/02/2019.

30. **Index to Register of Passport Applications 1851-1903.** Miss Caroline de Vaux Agnew applied for her passport in 1855. Findmypast, accessed 28/02/2019.
31. **Index to Register of Passport Applications 1851-1903 Image.** Handwritten record stating that Miss Caroline De Vaux Agnew applied for her passport on June 2 and that she was travelling with Miss C.
