

During Mercy Week, MIA hosted a six-session Generative Conversation: Opening Doors to an Emerging Future. This conversation was planned in the context of moving into the third century of living mercy in the spirit of Catherine McAuley.

The intention for the Generative Conversation was to provide a space for each, individually and collectively:

- -to listen to and learn from each other
- -to attend to the calls echoing deep in our hearts and minds
- -to re-source ourselves in a renewed sense of connection and purpose
- -to imagine together new ways forward for MIA in this current time.



Over the six sessions, participants across the Mercy World engaged in passionate conversations involving a variety of engaging topics including; how Catherine's story ignites our own passion and sense of purpose, listening and seeing unfamiliar ways of Mercying, attending to the sources of Mercying, attending to the call to co-create, imagining possible ways forward.

Key to the conversation were the following ponderings What might the future of MIA look like? What is wanting to emerge? What is Mercy's Agenda? What are the Non-Negotiables for MIA?

What follows here is a short summary of themes, insights and reflections gathered up over the six sessions.







Mercy needs to continue to engage the youth. For many, Mercy is the only version of Church that they will ever have.



Mercy Agenda

We need to work for oneness in whatever ways we can.

Recognise Mercy as an ecosystem.

Regarding inclusion – broaden our invite for communication to members, associates, companions, volunteers, coworkers.

Ecospirituality – working for and with the earth, growing the culture and community of Mercy to include wider Mercy Family.

Be the source of a spirituality that many don't find in other church circles.

Mercy Agenda: Climate Justice, care for women and girls, a global focus and risk taking.

Non-Negotiables

Gospel Spirituality. This was a real focus for Catherine. We have been so blessed to have retreats, conferences etc.

Continue initiatives in caring for the Earth, Displaced Peoples and Inclusion of the younger generation...

To Lean in with courage and hope.

For our particular refraction of Mercy, God is our centre and we are inspired by the tradition of Catherine McAuley. All our actions emerge from this core. For me, this is one of our non-negotiables.



...it's not just WHAT we do, but its HOW we do it. Catherine encouraged 'great tenderness in all things' and Pope Francis called us to a 'revolution of tenderness'.
