FACTS AND FIGURES



Women and girls are responsible for water collection in eight out of ten households with water off-premises.



More than 700 children under five years of age die every day from diarrhea linked to unsafe water and poor sanitation.



4.5 billion people lack safely managed sanitation services.



An estimated 20% of the world's aquifers is being over exploited leading to serious consequences such as land subsidence and saltwater intrusion.

80% of wastewater flows back into the ecosystem without being treated or reused.






A third of the world's biggest groundwater systems are already in distress.



700 million people worldwide could be displaced by intense water scarcity by 2030.



Water scarcity already affects 4 out of every 10 people.
