A Gift, or an Abuse of Human Rights?



Reflecting on this I began to get angry. Why should women and girls have to spend so many hours fetching water, because the government chooses to spend money on other things? Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) with 30 articles, was signed by every country and is a binding document.

Article I: All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights.

Article 3: Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.

Article 14 Everyone has the right to seek and to enjoy in other countries, asylum from persecution.

The International Bill of Rights is the UDHR with the two International Covenants:

- a) Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR) and
- **b)** Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR) that develop the articles cited in the UDHR. They are therefore binding covenants. Countries must report to the UN their progress on HR and other Covenants.



2018 marked 70 Years of the UDHR with the theme:

'Let's Make Human Rights a Fact and Not a Dream'
