# ETHOS PROGRAMME

Mon 25 May - Fri 29 May  
or Mon 28 Sept - Fri 2 Oct

This five-day programme open to all in the Mercy family is designed for administrators, directors, staff and board members of Mercy ministries and all who want to depth their experience of the Mercy story: past, present and future. The programme explores the particular characteristics of the founding women of Mercy and participants will be invited to consider their own leadership style as they live Mercy mission today.

This programme will be led by the staff at Mercy International Centre with the support of invited speakers. The programme includes an extended tour of the House of Mercy, a visit to Coolock House, a walking tour of Catherine's Dublin, input on the historical situation in Ireland in the 1800s, reflections on Mercy leadership,

Mercy Global Action and Mercy Global Presence.

At the end of the programme, participants will be invited to identify at least one way that they can incorporate their learning and experiences into their own ministries.

In 2020 Mercy Ethos will be offered twice: from the 25th - 29th May and from the 28th Sept - 2nd October.

Each programme will begin at 10.00am on Monday and conclude at 4.00pm on the Friday.
